MEDICAL SCHOOL HUMANITIES PROGRAM

Criteria

- US Citizenship, with preference for Texas residents
- Declared Humanities Major
- 3.7 GPA with 3.5 BCPM
- 510 MCAT with 125 per section
- While still at Rice, exposure to MMS through clinical research/research activities
- Facilitated Acceptance—students accepted into the program as junior at Rice who meet criteria, will receive an interview during the fall of their senior year

How the program works

- Students must submit the application form with three letters of recommendation, a personal statement and a transcript by the deadline of October 13, 2023. See the Office of the Registrar's website for transcript request information.
- Interviews with representatives from Rice and McGovern Medical School will be scheduled in early November. A background check will be performed following the interviews.
- Letters of acceptance to the Facilitated Acceptance program will be sent in late November-early December.

How the program works

- Students who are accepted into the program must take the MCAT between January and June of 2024 (prior to their senior year).
- Students will be invited to participate in a Summer Enrichment Experience at the McGovern Medical School between their junior and senior year at Rice.
- Students must complete the UT Health-McGovern Medical School application. See the medical school's <u>application process page</u> for more information.
- Please refer to the <u>TMDSAS website</u> for application deadlines and important dates.

How the program works

- Progress reports including disciplinary records and medical humanities enrichment activities will be sent to McGovern by Rice in Spring of junior year and fall of senior year.
- Students will be invited to interview for medical school admission in the fall of their senior year.
- Students must graduate in their Humanities major to remain eligible for the program.

What does "facilitated acceptance" mean?

- The intent of the program is to recruit Humanities majors for admission to McGovern medical school. Our shared goal is for all students admitted to this program to be admitted into McGovern medical school.
- HOWEVER, admission into the Facilitated Acceptance program does not guarantee admission to the McGovern Medical School at UTHealth. Students must meet additional requirements (including GPA, MCAT score, TMDSAS, criminal background check, and interview) before admission into McGovern Medical School is granted.

Eligibility requirements

- Declared Humanities <u>major</u>. (Humanities minor alone is insufficient.)
- Area majors will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- I will have either: a) completed three courses (9 credit hours) in a Humanities major by the end of the Spring semester in my sophomore year; or b) completed two courses (6 credit hours) in a Humanities major by the end of my sophomore year AND will be enrolled in at least two courses (6 credit hours) in a Humanities major for the Fall of my junior year (following the Fall add/drop deadline).

Eligibility requirements

 Any exceptions must be requested and approved by the Director of Medical Humanities (Dr. Kirsten Ostherr) in writing. Contact <Andrew.Stefl@rice.edu> for instructions on uploading this approval to your application.

Eligibility requirements

- Resume or CV
- Unofficial transcript
- Currently enrolled as a full-time student (12 or more credit hours) and will be a full-time student in the Fall semester of junior year
- U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident
- Reviewed the <u>requirements for matriculation into Medical School</u> posted on the Rice University Pre-Health Professions website of the Office of Academic Advising

How to prepare

- Describe your interest in medicine, including discussion of how your humanities background has prepared you for a medical career (Maximum 1500 words)
- Background in Medical Humanities coursework strongly recommended
- Depth of knowledge of humanities methods and content desired, not just credit hours
- Three letters of recommendation are required, with <u>at least one</u> <u>recommendation from a Rice Humanities professor or instructor</u> (graduate student instructors are ineligible). *Letters that can describe your humanities-based approach to medicine would be helpful.*
